Monthly Enrollment Report

In the month of March there were 236 appointments to assist with new applications and 48 appointments to assist with pended applications from February-March. For a total of 284 Interviews with clients.

205 applications were submitted for verification and enrollment. Of these, 205 were processed by the end of the month (includes the roll overs 0 from previous month) leaving the balance of 0 to roll over into April 2022 for approval.

Of the 205 that were processed, 192 were approved and 7 were denied. There were 6 pended remaining.

Currently applications are being processed, approved and the client enrolled in 7 business days. Current enrollment with EBMS is taking up to 3-5 days to appear active in system.

EBMS team involved in developing this recommendation were team members from Plan Documents that is aligned with EBMS Legal and Compliance teams, Provider Contracting, and Patient Care services

<u>Current Transition Services Allowed under WVHA Health Card Program: Brooks Center for Inpatient Rehabilitation</u>

WVHA currently is contracted with Brooks Center for Inpatient Rehabilitation which is affiliated with Halifax Medical Center. These services are available for health card members who are transitioning from inpatient hospital care and need additional rehabilitation services to be discharged safely to home to continue rehabilitating and achieving the best possible health outcomes. Each case is reviewed by an intake coordinator to determine whether a patient would meet admission criteria based off medical acuity and ability to meet the rigorous rehabilitation schedule (Mon-Fri minimum 15 hours per week). The goals of the program are to partner with the patient and family to empower patients to achieve the highest level of recovery and participation in life.

Admission Criteria and Intake Process

- Physician order requesting patient be admitted to Brooks Center for Inpatient Rehabilitation
- Patient Intake completed and decision for admission is based off the admission criteria
 - Patients need to meet Medicare guidelines for an acute inpatient stay
 - Criteria for acute inpatient stay includes collaboration with Nursing, Therapy, and Patient medical needs
 - o The patient needs to be receiving 2 forms of therapy to be considered for admission
 - o They admit 13 different medical diagnosis as well as medical complexity (some of which are mentioned in the brochure)
 - o There is a holistic evaluation completed to include medical needs, therapy needs, discharge plan, and followed up access to continued therapy needs
 - Part of the evaluation is ensuring the patient has a safe discharge to home

<u>EBMS Recommendation for additional services for WVHA Health Card Program: Skilled Nursing</u> Services

Based on various medical and social determinants of health, there are Health Card members who wouldn't qualify for Inpatient Rehabilitation services through Brooks Center for Inpatient Rehabilitation. But these individuals still need additional services to ensure a safe discharge to home and plan to continue with outpatient rehabilitation services. Currently the Health Card Program excludes Home Nursing Services. We recommend that continue because of the inability to manage medical necessity in contrast of ease of service for patient. However, EBMS does recommend amending the Health Card Program to include Skilled Nursing Services through other licensed and contracted facilities. Below you will find the definition as well as a proposed amendment to add facility-based Skilled Nursing Services to the current services offered under the WVHA Health Card Program.

Skilled Nursing Services (SNF) definition (per Medicare)

Skilled care is nursing and therapy care that can only be safely and effectively performed by, or under the supervision of, licensed professionals or technical personnel. It's health care given when you need skilled nursing or skilled therapy to treat, manage, and observe your condition, and evaluate your care.

Proposed Plan language for Skilled Nursing Facility

Skilled Nursing Facility Care. The room and board and nursing care furnished by a Skilled Nursing Facility will be payable if and when:

- (a) The patient is covered because of an authorized covered in patient stay at a WVHA contracted facility; and
- (b) The attending Physician certifies that the confinement is Medically Necessary; and
- (c) The attending Physician completes a treatment plan which includes a diagnosis, the proposed course of treatment and the projected date of discharge from the Skilled Nursing Facility
- (d) SNF services are authorized for 60 days per patient per plan year- industry standard for this type of benefit
- (e) Ambulance Services are excluded with the exception for when a medically necessary transport occurs from an inpatient setting at a WVHA contracted facility to a contracted Skilled Nursing Facility.

You will need to maintain the emails on these lists and add/remove emails as needed. Board members and CAC members get updated once a year in January, and occasionally will need to be updated based on new appointments or resignations throughout the year.

Scheduling CAC/Board Meeting "Tentatively Scheduled Meetings" Annually

By November, update annual meeting schedule for the next year and schedule rooms in advance.

CAC meets on Tuesdays at 5:15pm. No meetings from July – November, on Hiatus. Board meets on Thursdays at 5:00pm

For City of Deland, schedule most meetings with Coco Montanez, <u>Montaneza@deland.org</u>, except for the two September initial and budget hearing meetings. These two meetings will be TBA.

Before the WVHA can schedule either the Initial Budget Hearing or the Final Budget Hearing, you will need to check with the County of Volusia and the Volusia County School Board as the WVHA cannot schedule these budget hearings on the same date as either of theirs. It is typically difficult to schedule the Final Budget hearing at the end of September. In March/April of the current year, start to schedule dates for the two budget hearings. Contact the Police Department Records Department to schedule the Final Budget Hearing, as this date typically conflicts with a meeting that the City of DeLand holds. The Initial budget hearing will be scheduled two weeks prior to the Final budget hearing and the City of DeLand Commission Chamber is usually available.

Creating CAC/Board Agenda for Current Month

There is not much deviation in the agenda from year to year. So the first step in creating an agenda for the current month is to Copy and Paste the agenda from same month of the prior year. For example, for a January meeting in 2023, start by copying and pasting the January 2022 agenda. Next step is to update dates, add any items that were added to the agenda item from the prior month's meeting/minutes and remove any old items from the prior year agenda that was a one-time discussion item. Advance work will need to be done to schedule with the upcoming speakers in advance.

Distribution of Transcribed CAC/Board Meeting Minutes

Once minutes have been transcribed, typically one week following the CAC/Board meeting, email the draft minutes to the CAC email list or Board email list, accordingly. On this email, note that any changes to the minutes, should be brought to your attention immediately but no later than two Mondays prior to the next scheduled monthly meeting. This allows the Board/CAC members several weeks to review the minutes for accuracy prior to having to vote on them.

Distributing Documents in Preparation for CAC Meeting

One week out from the Tuesday's scheduled CAC meeting, the meeting packet is scanned to include the agenda, minutes from last meetings that need to be approved by the CAC and any other document needed for this upcoming meeting. Again, refer back to the meeting packet that was created one year prior to ensure all records are included. The scanned meeting packet is then emailed to the following contact lists: CAC, Funded Agencies and New Applicants and the board member designated to attend this CAC meeting. Most agencies will receive this email two times as they may be on both the Funded Agencies & New Applicants contact list.

LEGAL UPDATE MEMORANDUM

RE: West Volusia Hospital Authority - Update for April 21, 2022 Regular Meeting

Summarized below are updates on active legal matters/issues for which some new information has become available since my last legal update. This Memorandum will not reflect updates on matters resolved by a final vote of the Board and thereby already summarized in the November 18, 2021 Regular Meeting Minutes.

I. New Methodology for Calculating the Medicaid Contribution Required from Counties and/or Hospital Districts Who "Benefit" from the Medicaid Program—SB 1520/HB 5301 (2013 Florida Legislature) [See new info. in italics and bold] [See new info. in italics and bold] Refer back to Legal Update Memorandum dated 10/12/21 for additional background details.]

In 2012 the Florida Legislature passed HB-5301 which required counties and/or hospital districts who "benefit" from the Medicaid program to catch up on disputed Medicaid bills dating back to 2001. After much research, discussion and legal and political wrangling, WVHA ultimately resolved to continue its longstanding commitment to reimburse the County of Volusia (the "County") for the County's required contribution to the State of Florida Medicaid Program for hospital bill payments on behalf of indigent residents of the West Volusia Tax District. For both the unpaid Medicaid bills dating back to 2001 and future Medicaid bills, the County and WVHA agreed to set aside their disagreement about whether WVHA actually "benefits" from the Medicaid program as do the other hospital districts (Halifax and Southeast Volusia) which receive direct Medicaid payments for services rendered at hospitals which they own and operate. Instead, the ultimate resolution to this dispute was WVHA's agreement to continue reimbursing the County for a portion of its required contribution to the Medicaid Program as long as the County certified that it had verified that hospital bills apportioned to WVHA concerned healthcare services for persons who were indigent residents of the West Volusia Tax District at the time of service. This agreed-upon Medicaid billing procedure was fully implemented and was the basis for the Board's approval of all Medicaid payments from 2012-13 through 2020-21 fiscal years.

For the past several years, counsel has agreed with DRT that WVHA should agree with Halifax and Southeast to continue the same contribution percentages for Medicaid Match payments as were jointly agreed for the 2015-16 through 2016-21 transitional years. However, counsel has repeatedly cautioned that the Board review the above summarized background to what was agreed only as a temporary fix and give due consideration that the transitional phase in period will end with State Fiscal Year 2019-20. At that time, all unresolved legal issues will

likely need to be resolved between WVHA, the County and all interested parties. If a jointly agreed upon new methodology for a fair and equitable division of Medicaid costs cannot be agreed, WVHA may need to obtain a definitive ruling on whether WVHA actually "benefits" from the Medicaid program to allow the County to allocate it any portion of the Medicaid costs; whether WVHA can legally reimburse for Lake County non-residents who have a West Volusia zip code in spite of the restriction in its Enabling Legislation to only funds costs for "residents" of the Tax District: as well as whether the County is dealing with WVHA fairly in dividing percentages between hospital and nursing home stays by Medicaid enrollees.

• • • •

At its September 23-2021 Board Meeting, the Board unanimously adopted Motion 108-2021: Subject to further negotiations and hoped for development of alternatives that WVHA's Accountant and Attorney would recommend that the WVHA Board accept, the WVHA Board hereby notes its objection to what it understands is County staff's proposal (dated 9/22/2021) to change the longstanding methodology for the County's division of Medicaid Match costs between hospital districts such that Halifax would pay approximately a half million dollars less, WVHA would pay a half million dollars more and SEVD would pay approximately \$40,000 more than they would pursuant to the longstanding and mutually agreed methodology for splitting the County's Medicaid Match costs. (The County's own share to cover nursing home costs remains unchanged in the latest proposal.) Preliminarily and subject to further research, WVHA objects to any division by the County Council that does not give a reasonable and ordinary interpretation to the qualification in Chapter 409.915(5) which only authorizes the County Council to divide its Medicaid Match responsibilities to hospital districts "which benefit from the Medicaid Program." Until 2020 when WVHA's hospital sale agreement with Advent Health terminated, it was arguable that at least the WVHA indirectly obtained some benefit from the Medicaid Program. But currently WVHA does not have any such basis for the County Council determining that it "benefits from the Medicaid Program." Therefore, any division of the Medicaid Match responsibilities should now fall solely upon the other hospital districts that own and operate hospitals and thereby clearly do benefit from the Medicaid Program through the receipt of millions of dollars in direct payments to reimburse care for patients who are both residents and non-residents of the County of Volusia.

Accordingly, the Board authorizes the Attorney to take all reasonable and necessary steps to obtain outside counsel and legislative expertise to defend WVHA should the County staff recommend, and the County Council adopt this objectionable division of Medicaid Match costs, including subcontracting with outside counsel and experts to handle immediate matters pending the Board's ability to interview and retain counsel at a future Regular or Special Meeting.

At its October 21, 2021 Board Meeting, the Board unanimously approved an engagement letter with Phelps Dunbar LLP for that law firm to represent it concerning Motion 108-2021, specifically authorizing it as follows:

Unless directed otherwise by the Board or the WVHA Attorney, the Authority's engagement of Phelps Dunbar will authorize us to take all appropriate actions to further the Authority's interests in this matter as set forth in Motion 108-2021 and any subsequent Board motions or directives.

At its November 18, 2021 Board Meeting, the Board unanimously approved an engagement letter with Heffley & Associates to perform public affairs monitoring and lobbying on behalf of matters affecting its interest in Florida state government, including assisting in the implementation of Motion 108-2021.

Both Phelps Dunbar and Heffley & Associates are responsible for keeping the Board informed concerning their work on behalf of WVHA. Feel free to contact them directly or me with any specific questions. Counsel will continue monitoring and supervising the performance of both Phelps Dunbar and Heffley & Associates and notify the Board if either of them identifies a need for Board policy decisions beyond the directions set forth plainly in Motion 108-2021 and within their respective retainer agreements.

II. WVHA as Plaintiff in Federal Multidistrict Litigation for National Prescription Opiate Litigation, James Vickaryous, Managing Partner of Vickaryous Law Firm. [See new info. in italics and bold]

Counsel talked preliminarily with Jim Vickaryous, the Managing Partner of the Vickaryous Law Firm about WVHA retaining his law firm to represent WVHA on a contingency basis and file a lawsuit on behalf of WVHA in the federal multidistrict litigation for national prescription opiate litigation. Attorney Vickaryous plans to present a formal proposal to explain the details, but in a nutshell the proposed representation would offer WVHA a seat at the table among many other governmental and private entities around the nation that are suing pharmaceutical companies. These lawsuits are seeking to recover damages related to the substantial health care and prescription costs that have been paid to treat residents who became addicted to opioids. As of this writing, counsel has not yet received a draft of the proposed retainer agreement or the presentation materials. Attorney Vickaryous has indicated in an introductory call that if desired, WVHA would become one of several Florida based local government clients which his firm would represent. The contingency basis of the representation would provide that the Vickaryous Law Firm would be paid 20% of any net recovery after costs and WVHA would keep the remaining 80%. Attorney Vickaryous believes that it would be important to get WVHA's lawsuit on file as soon as practicable before settlement talks begin and conclude concerning a Tier I lawsuit that is scheduled for trial in Ohio during October, 2019. Attorney Vickaryous believes that the defendants in that lawsuit may want to negotiate a global settlement of all pending lawsuits and it would be advantageous for WVHA to have a seat at that table, particularly in light of the substantial annual budget expenses being paid to SMA and for prescriptions that are directly related to the opioid epidemic. Counsel expects to receive and review the details prior to the March meeting and have a recommendation as to the form of the retainer agreement at that time. As an overall matter, the proposal sounds like a potential opportunity for WVHA to recoup substantial taxpayer dollars, but it may take some time before any recovery is obtained. Following the Board's authorization of Chair Craig to sign the proposed contingency

agreement subject to a clarification that the net of any recovery to WVHA only be reduced to reimburse "reasonable" attorney's fees, Chair Craig has executed the revised agreement and it is being circulated for signatures by all the retained co-counsel. As previously emailed, WVHA's complaint in the national opioid litigation was initially filed in federal court in the Middle District of Florida on September 10, 2019. On September 26, 2019, that case was transferred to the Northern District of Ohio where is has been consolidated with the thousands of other pending cases in that multidistrict opioid litigation.

As you recall from his last in-person attendance at the October 2021 Board meeting, WVHA's primary liaise to class representatives in the ongoing multidistrict opioid litigation is Attorney Eric Romano. In a status letter dated 3/24/2022 from Attorney Romano to WVHA (forwarded to Board members in a 3/29/2022 email), he explains that a conflict has arisen which prevents his law firm from continuing to represent WVHA and its hospital district clients without being in conflict with their also continuing to represent cities and counties. Attorney Romano and his law group desire to continue representation of the counties and cities, which makes financial sense because they are likely to obtain a recovery from those entities under the current terms of the negotiated settlements.

In that letter, Attorney Romano sets forth four (4) options for WVHA, including an option to dismiss its complaint entirely and forego any opportunity to benefit from current or future settlements of these cases or allow new class action counsel to take over this representation and remain involved in the overall litigation.

In considering the option to transfer WVHA's case to new class counsel, consider that WVHA can reconfigure its legal team and pursue a more aggressive posture (along with Halifax) vis-a-vis the State and County, but right now it appears that Halifax and other districts that actually operate hospitals are more likely to receive actual money from this new approach than WVHA which doesn't own a hospital. Recall that settlements have already been provisionally reached between class counsel and some defendants including, Purdue and Mallinckrodt PLC. But, based on counsel's understanding of how these settlement negotiations have been concluded thus far, essentially all of the settlement proceeds are being directed towards states, counties and cities to decide in their discretion how to distribute the settlement proceeds for funding opioid addiction prevention and treatment programming. As Attorney Romano explains in his letter, the State of Florida and County of Volusia have not been returning his repeated calls, emails and letters to engage them in any discussion about directing a portion of the proceeds that they would receive to hospitals or hospital districts. It is impossible to know for sure, but counsel doesn't see much chance that any direct settlement funds will drip down to hospital districts even with new class counsel that is representing only hospitals and hospital districts.

Ultimately, this is a business decision for the Board to decide, but the likelihood of recovery seems much lower than it did in 2019 when WVHA could reasonable hope that hospital districts would be treated the same as any other claimant in the settlement process. On the other hand, going forward will likely require both legal and

administrative support into help any new counsel prove that WVHA is entitled to recover damages based upon the millions in funding it provided to SMA and the hospitals for opioid addiction related services. With other more pressing litigation and administrative matters pending, holding open this possibility for a recovery should be carefully weighed against the need to concentrate limited resources on these other pending matters.

III. Potential Summary Benefits Plan and Provider Changes Re: Availability of Facility-Based Skilled Nursing Care After Already Covered Services

This Discussion Agenda item follows up on months of research and investigation to determine whether there is a gap in the continuum of care that is available to members who receive covered inpatient health care such as surgery and then thereafter their hospital doctors determine that they require additional skilled nursing care before they are safe to return home. The gap was identified because of concerns raised by one Health Card member who was not admitted to Brooks Center for Inpatient Rehabilitation even after a Halifax hospital doctor determined that skilled nursing care was recommended prior to this patient's release back home. The particulars of that case have since been well researched by MiCare clinicians and staff and resolved through some interventions that member was willing to accept and without others that member refused. For the sake of other members who might experience similar needs in the future, EBMS/Veracity was asked in February to do research on industry standards, costs and budget implications of amending the listing of benefits available under the Health Card Program and make a recommendation for closing any gaps in care that could be reasonably managed and budgeted. Yesterday counsel reviewed an early draft of the proposed recommendation, suggested several clarifications and would recommend approval of the final version as to its form. Practically, the amendment can be styled simply as an amendment to the overall Program and it doesn't have to be styled as an addendum which is more appropriate for ERISA-qualified plans, which the WVHA's Health Card Program is not such a plan.

IV. General Compliance with the Sunshine Law [See new info. in italics and bold]

The Government in the Sunshine Law, section 286.011, Florida Statutes, provides in pertinent part:

"All meetings of any board or commission . . . of any agency or authority of any county, municipal corporation, or political subdivision . . . at which official acts are to be taken are declared to be public meetings open to the public at all times, and no resolution, rule, or formal action shall be considered binding except as taken or made at such meeting."

It is impossible to summarize all relevant points of the Sunshine Law, but please note that courts uniformly interpret this provision as prohibiting two or more members of the same board or commission from talking about or discussing any matter on which foreseeable action will be taken by the pubic board or commission. (If your conversation with another board member concerns personal or business matters unrelated to the Authority, the Sunshine Law does not apply)

Please note that the Sunshine Law DOES apply to "off-the record" chats during meetings or during breaks, written correspondence, telephone conversations and e-mails exchanges between two or more board members if such communication concerns matters likely to come before the Board; provided however, it is permissible for one board member to send correspondence to the rest of the board outside of a public meeting as long as this correspondence does not result in replies or other back and forth exchanges until a public meeting is convened for such discussion and also the correspondence is made available to interested members of the public.

The Sunshine Law also prohibits nonmembers (staff, lawyers, accountants, and members of the public) from serving as liaisons between Board members concerning matters likely to come before the Board.

With the increased use of social media accounts, including Facebook and other community and political blogs, Board members should be mindful of the following Florida Attorney General guidance before posting on Facebook, or other blogs an opinion or viewpoint on matters likely to come before the Board. In AG Opinion 08-07, the Florida Attorney General concluded that the use of a website blog or message board to solicit comment from other members of the board or commission by their response on matters that would come before the board would trigger the requirements of the Sunshine Law. As stated therein:

"While there is no statutory prohibition against a city council member posting comments on a privately maintained electronic bulletin board or blog, members of the board or commission must not engage in an exchange or discussion of matters that foreseeably will come before the board or commission for official action. The use of such an electronic means of posting one's comments and the inherent availability of other participants or contributors to act as liaisons would create an environment that could easily become a forum for members of a board or commission to discuss official issues which should most appropriately be conducted at a public meeting in compliance with the Government in the Sunshine Law. It would be incumbent upon the commission members to avoid any action that could be construed as an attempt to evade the requirements of the law."
