#### **Call to Order**

Chair Coen called the workshop to order. The meeting took place at DeLand City Hall in the Commission Chamber, located at 120 S. Florida Ave., DeLand, Florida, having been legally noticed in the Daytona Beach News-Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in Volusia County, commencing at 4:09 p.m.

#### **Approval of Proposed Agenda**

Motion 064 - 2022 Commissioner Pepin motioned to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion. The motion passed by a 4-0-1 vote.

#### **Citizens Comments**

#### **Discussion Items**

#### **Millage Rate**

Mr. Small provided the legal context for the workshop, outlined the Truth in Millage (TRIM) procedures, and explained the rolled-back rate. He noted that the workshop would be discussion only, and any proposed millage rate would be approved by resolution at the regular meeting following the workshop.

#### WVHA 2022-2023 Budget Forecast

Mr. Chalfour outlined changes in property values, reviewed the millage rate options, and explained his working budget. He stated that he had updated the budget since the agenda was posted, and he included numbers with and without Medicaid.

Chair Coen noted Healthy Communities Kid Care Outreach and application screening for RAAO and THND would not be a 10% increase as listed on the working budget. She added that she did not think TPA Services would be a 10% increase either.

#### **Funding Applications and Amounts Requested**

Commissioner Manning noted Healthcare Navigation and New Hope were discontinued programs.

There was not any Board discussion regarding the funding applications.

There was discussion and consensus that the rolled-back millage rate should be adopted during the Regular Meeting commencing upon the conclusion of the workshop.

#### **County's Proposed Medicaid Reimbursement Expense**

Mr. Chalfour recommended that the rolled-back rate be used at the current time, and the Board could lower the rate in September if they decided not to include Medicaid in the budget. He added that it would be a reduction in taxes for the taxpayers.

Mr. Small noted that they would not know the outcome of the litigation by September; that the numbers with and without Medicaid were included so that the Board could begin thinking about the option; and that they did not need to make a decision at this time.

He noted that full-service companies have automated systems with internal controls, and Vision HR is audited as a PEO (Professional Employment Organization) yearly.

Ms. Tebo recommended that the WVHA Board use Vision HR for payroll services.





Building Healthier Communities One Person At A Time! On behalf of Hispanic Health Initiatives' Board, staff and volunteers, we commend the WVHA Board for having the foresight to take a proactive approach to the wellbeing and health of the west Volusia residents they serve.

The "Cuidando Mi Salud/Taking Care of My Health" (CMS/TCMH) program creates access to health care by conveniently providing appropriate health information and services directly into the community via one-on-one, face to face outreach events throughout west Volusia County. HHI employs a take to the community approach and seeks its target population at venues such as, food pantries, food kitchens, churches, community events and partner agencies. By providing programs with an emphasis on being culturally sensitive and linguistically correct and for the community, where they live, work, play and pray, HHI eliminates barriers restricting west Volusia's medically under-served resident's access to competent health and social services.

The CMS/TCMH face-to-face encounters are aimed at creating meaningful opportunities for medically underserved individuals and families to learn, begin to advocate for themselves and connect with much needed health information and services. HHI's programs provide participants the ability to immediately and many times unexpectedly, discover and begin to address their risk for chronic diseases such as diabetes type II. Often, those discoveries are in their early stages, while avoidable health problems associated with those conditions can still be controlled, prolonged or prevented. The CMS/TCMH program promotes and encourages lifestyle changes that include; weight loss, increased physical activity, nutritional changes and regular primary care visits, all leading to the reduction of the risk for chronic disease.

Since the year 2020 HHI has taken on other projects such as hosting several bi-lingual open forum zoom meetings with clinical trial research experts providing relevant COVID-19 information, encouraging vaccination, answering questions and dispelling rumors and misbeliefs surrounding the COVID-19 vaccine and the pandemic. As well as, a COVID-19 PPE (sanitizers, masks, gloves, etc...) and information safety bag distribution of over 10,000 bags, dissemination of over 500 at home COVID-19 test kits, Toys for Tots registration and toy giveaway for 1800+ west Volusia children and participated in two community health needs assessments. ALL FREE to the community HHI serves throughout its service area.

Ultimately, HHI accomplishes the triple aim of reducing medical costs for, improving the health of and creating a better quality of life for the medically under-served residents of west Volusia.

#### **Background and Program Description:**

Since 2000, HHI's service model has been distinguished by the use of paraprofessional bilingual Community Health Workers (CHW). The utilization of bilingual CHWs has been recognized as a best practice for improving access to health care among uninsured and medically under-served individuals.

HHI's programs promote wellness and improve health indicators among medically under-served adults by providing community based, culturally- and linguistically competent chronic disease health screening and education. As part of the West Volusia Hospital Authority grant, HHI provides eligible (uninsured, low income residents) west Volusia residents FREE chronic disease health screening intended to bring awareness to the participants current health status and improve their health risk profiles as determined by body mass index (B.M.I.), blood glucose, blood pressure, and cholesterol levels. Based on the screen results HHI's CHWs provide an

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
individualized one-on-one chronic disease education that includes helping the participant prepare an action plan of healthier lifestyle goals to start addressing issues identified through the health risk assessment.

#### Need:

A Health of the Hispanic Community in Volusia County, 2017 special report from the Florida Health department stated: (flhealthcharts.com)

- In 2017, Hispanic residents in Volusia County died from diabetes at a rate higher than the county, state, U.S., and the HP2020 target.
- The chronic kidney disease death rate for Hispanic residents was higher than the rates for the county and state by 5.8 percent and 23.3 percent, respectively.
- The percent of Hispanic adults with pre-diabetes increased by 117 percent (2013-2016).

As outlined in figure 1 below, in 2019 the rate for preventable hospitalizations under 65 from diabetes in Volusia County (158.4) was slightly above the rate for the state of Florida (147.1). (flhealthcharts.com)



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A 2017 public health data brief (figure 2), published by the Volusia county DOH, outlines diabetic emergency room visits, in the year 2016, for Volusia residents. The results for the northwest and southwest areas were 5748 individual visits totaling \$69,230,198 dollars (averaging \$8,200 per visit). (FL DOH - Public Health Data Brief)

#### **Activities:**

#### "Cuidando Mi Salud/Taking Care of My Health" Health Risk Assessment (HRA):

The HRA consists of biometric and behavioral screening for risks of metabolic (diabetes) and cardiovascular disease. Measures include B.M.I., blood glucose, blood pressure, cholesterol, and a personal and familial health history. Results of the biometric screening and health history are discussed in a one-on-one coaching session by HHI's CHWs. In addition, each participant receives behavioral education using evidence based curricula and strategies for those whose show increased risk for chronic disease. Behavioral education focuses on regular primary care visits, healthy nutrition and regular physical activity, for the prevention and self-management of chronic disease such as cardiovascular and diabetes type II. The coaching and behavioral education includes recommendations and referrals for ongoing primary and/or behavioral health care, as indicated by the screening outcomes. In addition, the HRA participant formulates, with the help of the CHW, a healthier lifestyle action plan of goals to use in their strategy for the prevention or self-management of chronic disease. The HRA goals create for the individual; an awareness of lifestyle related risk factors for chronic disease and engages those high-risk individuals with behavioral modifications known to improve clinical outcomes related to chronic disease progression.

#### **Outcomes & Achievements:**

Recently HHI was fortunate to obtain testimonials from 1 past and 2 present CMS/TCMH participants stating:

- "I first saw you back in 2019 and I was not in control of my conditions. I was extremely
  obese and needed several different medications. Because of your HRA, since then, I have
  lost over 80lbs. and I'm down to only 3 medications"
- "Because of you I learned that I might have high blood pressure. So I went to the clinic and now I'm taking blood pressure medication to try and keep it under control"
- Three months after HHI's initial encounter with the participant they lowered their A1C from 11% to 7%. (WVHA card holder/MiCare patient)

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The HHI/WVHA contract began in October 2021 and as of July 31, 2022, program outcomes are as follows: (*Not all participants are reimbursable under the guidelines of the WVHA contract.*)

- > 80 "Cuidando Mi Salud/Taking Care of My Health" HRA sessions held
- ➢ 384 participants were served through the program
- 296 participants billed under the guidelines of the WVHA contract, were screened for Blood Pressure, B.M.I., Cholesterol, Glucose.
- 225 participants billed under the guidelines of the WVHA contract, received one-on-one health and behavioral education using evidence based curricula and strategies focused on regular primary care visits, healthy nutrition and regular physical activity, for the prevention and self-management of chronic disease.
- ➢ 9 participants billed under the guidelines of the WVHA contract, received follow-up service to support their self-management of chronic disease.
- All of the HRA participants billed under the guidelines of the WVHA contract, received direct case management including additional CHW's support for the behavioral education, contacting and collaborating with relevant health care providers, providing immediate referrals to appropriate health care providers, connecting with WVHA's Health Card prescreening enrollment service providers and other medical and/or social services needed.
- 296 participants were referred to the House Next Door for WVHA's Health Card prescreening enrollment service and appropriate health care providers (NEFHS & Good Samaritan) for primary care services

# Additional positive participant outcomes obtained through screening and health and behavioral education:

- Increased knowledge and awareness of their current health status related to chronic disease for at -risk adults
- Increased knowledge and awareness of healthier nutrition substitutes and techniques for the prevention and/or self-management of chronic disease conditions for at -risk adults
- Increased knowledge and awareness of physical activity techniques for the prevention and/or self-management of chronic disease conditions for at -risk adults
- Increased knowledge and awareness of primary care options available within the west Volusia area

The need for early interventions, for persons at risk for chronic disease, incorporates both clinical and financial benefits, for them, as well as, the community they live in. Studies have shown that making lifestyle changes that include losing weight, increasing physical activity and nutritional changes can greatly reduce the risk for chronic disease. Many of the outcomes listed above are associated with positive and healthy lifestyle changes because of the interventions participants received through HHI's CMS/TCMH program, providing West Volusia residents who accessed the program, the knowledge and tools needed in the prevention or control of chronic disease.

#### **Program Value/Savings:**

HHI regularly encounters participants without any knowledge of their current health status or the local primary care options available to them. On several occasions HHI's CMS/TCMH program

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has been the means for that eye opening moment when a participant who felt that their health was fine, realized, based on their health screen results, they now have to seek a doctor to further investigate potential issues with their health.

Because of the CMS/TCMH program's screening interventions and the education utilizing evidence based curricula and strategies for the prevention or self-management of chronic disease, the positive health outcomes achieved by the program's participants, are proof of the program's cost saving to the WVHA and the west Volusia community as a whole.

All of HHI's health programs help address existing disparities related to access to health care and the cost burden of uncontrolled diseases and conditions. HHI's programs provide every participant with a greater potential for the prevention and/or control of disease, which creates an opportunity for enormous savings for both the participant and the community they live in.

#### Lessons Learned:

#### Successes:

- HHI has over 20 years' experience, successfully educating, advocating for and connecting, thousands of central Florida's medically underserved residents to health and social services. The organization has successfully managed several multi- year Federal, State and foundation grants totaling in the millions of dollars. HHI stands ready to help the WVHA Board in any capacity they see fit.
- Participants who have adhered to what they learned as a result of HHI's CMS/TCMH program can decrease their risk for uncontrolled chronic disease.
- HHI continues to build collaborative partnerships with various grassroots organizations, businesses and governmental agencies. These successful partnerships lead to improvement in the delivery of health and human services for West Volusia's disadvantaged residents. HHI's outreach sites include, among others, churches, food pantries and partner agency locations. These relationships will continue to help HHI and others to bring much needed health and human services directly into the community.
- HHI and several other WVHA grantees remain as members of The West Volusia Collaborative.

#### Challenges:

- The misconception that HHI is providing duplicate services with its chronic disease screening and education program. A search for local resources that provide chronic disease awareness and education, showed HHI as the only source for bilingual chronic disease health risk assessments free of charge for indigent populations of west Volusia.
- Finding additional funding outside of the WVHA grant has been a consistent challenge for HHI.

#### **Recommendations:**

Studies have shown the return on investment (ROI) for chronic disease prevention and self-management programs range from \$3 to \$5 or more for every dollar invested. Expansion of HHI's funding and programs would prove to be a practical decision for any entity who has an interest in creating access to competent health care options for our most vulnerable populations.

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#### August 2022 Report to the West Volusia Hospital Authority Board

### Background

For over 50 years, Community Legal Services of Mid-Florida, Inc. (CLSMF) has provided free legal assistance and advocacy to Central Florida's low- to moderate-income residents.

In grant year 2016-2017, CLSMF entered into an agreement with the West Volusia Hospital Authority (WVHA) to provide services to WVHA cardholders to resolve legal issues preventing them from qualifying for alternative types of healthcare. The CLSMF medical-legal partnership (MLP) represents WVHA cardholders in initial applications for and denials of benefits from the Social Security Administration (SSA), Medicaid, Medicare, or Veterans benefits. These cases are most often for cardholders who should be receiving other health coverage on account of their disability, and are therefore, high need, high-cost utilizers of WVHA services. By moving these WVHA cardholders to other available health coverage, CLSMF saves West Volusia taxpayers money.

Recognizing the hardship WVHA cardholders faced when there was no contract in place between the WVHA and any hospital for Emergency Department services, the Board has also approved the MLP to defend cardholders against collection attempts by AdventHealth DeLand, AdventHealth Fish Memorial, or Halifax Medical Center of Deltona for these services. The MLP provides cardholders with legal advice regarding debt collections and working with AdventHealth and Halifax to streamline the process to assist cardholders with qualifying for the various patient financial assistance programs.

#### Services

So far this grant cycle (October 1, 2021 to July 31, 2022):

- 30 unique WVHA cardholders served in 33 different cases
- 1 case "rejected" because the patient declined services after referral
- 15 cases opened since start of 2021-2022 grant cycle, 18 cases that were opened in a prior funding cycle and remained active
- 6 Emergency Department bill cases, 26 SSA disability cases, 1 Medicaid case
- 20 cases have been closed, 13 remain open pending resolution
- 3 cardholders now with alternative health coverage
- \$2,545 monthly SSA benefits
- \$50,981.75 retroactive SSA benefits
- \$57,970.11 Emergency Department bills avoided

Since start of WVHA funding (2016-2017):

- 26 cardholders now with alternative health coverage
- \$17,005.00 monthly SSA benefits (does not include annual COLA increases)
- \$333,963.49 retroactive SSA benefits
- \$97,756.40 Emergency Department bills avoided

In addition to the WVHA-funded services above, CLSMF offers access to the entire firm to provide truly holistic legal services to all clients with funding from a variety of other sources. WVHA clients have been referred to other in-house units for assistance with evictions, fair housing offenses, housing and credit counseling, advanced directives, and Medicaid and estate planning.

#### Partnership Activities

CLSMF continues to lead the West Volusia Collaborative, created in 2018 in coordination with other WVHA-funded organizations. This Collaborative meets monthly to discuss upcoming community events, individual agency programs, and other information relevant to our mutual patients/clients. MLP advocates provide updates to this group on legal issues that may affect their WVHA cardholder patients/clients, and occasionally arranges for other CLSMF advocates to present on their relevant practice areas.

CLSMF continues to strengthen our partnership with the miCare healthcare team, moving closer to a fully integrated MLP model. The miCare staff has been extremely receptive to working with the MLP to make referrals for services via the MLP's online referral. We work together to identify patients who should meet the definition of "disabled," and screen them for eligibility for state and federal programs for the disabled.

Additionally, this grant year we have successfully negotiated a flat rate for medical records provided by third-party records custodian CIOX. CIOX maintains records for AdventHealth and under Florida law can charge \$1 per page. This often resulted in hundreds, sometimes thousands, of dollars in medical records costs per case. This change will greatly reduce those costs.

#### **Client Success Story**

(Name has been changed to protect client confidentiality)

Martha has been homeless for a few years, living in a tent. She was diagnosed with stage 3 cancer in 2021 and began to receive chemotherapy. Receiving chemo while homeless has made treatment and recovery much more difficult for Martha. Jeanette at miCare Clinic identified Martha as a patient who may qualify for disability benefits and used CLSMF's online referral to refer her case to the MLP.

The MLP's advocate, Lisa, submitted Martha's disability application and within weeks she was awarded benefits! Martha now receives monthly SSI benefits of \$794 and Medicaid. She is no longer a WVHA cardholder. Since receiving her benefits, Martha has been able to schedule surgery to have the cancer removed and has begun saving for an apartment.

Welcome to the WVHA! Let me introduce myself. I am Eric Horst, CFO for SMA Healthcare. I would like to request inclusion on the August 18 agenda for the topic "LIP Funding for SMA Healthcare".

Over the last four years, SMA has received Low Income Pool (LIP) funding from the Agency for Healthcare Administration (AHCA). This funding helps compensate for unreimbursed expenses related to providing services to low income clients, also described as "Charity Care". SMA is one of 10 behavioral health organizations in the state that have achieved Central Receiving System (CRS) certification. That CRS designation is a requirement for participation in LIP funding. Another requirement, is to partner with a community government organization to to provide an Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT). The IGT is a transfer of community funding directly to AHCA. Through ACHA, the funds are matched by federal Medicaid dollars, the original IGT and match amount are returned to SMA to pay for charity care costs related to provision of behavioral health services. During FY 2022, the WVHA provided \$257,582 from the "Baker" act contract that was matched by \$528,448 in Medicaid dollars and subsequently paid to SMA. The dollars transferred from the WVHA comes out of the existing contracts with SMA and does not result in additional expense to the WVHA. We expect the FY 23 match requirement to be near the \$300,000 level, however we won't know the exact amount until AHCA completes their work and submits a new Letter of Agreement (LOA) to the WVHA.

Participation in the LIP program, is based on our ability to provide an executed LOA by 10/1/2022. The purpose of asking to be included on the August agenda is to answer any question the board may have in advance of that deadline. AHCA will not produce the LOA until mid-September. So we will need to ask for approval of that specific agreement at the September board meeting.

I attached an earlier LOA, let me know if you have any questions.

I learned that WVHA did not have its own email server when trying to get emails copied to a hard drive from DRT. DRT was storing the WVHA emails on its Microsoft exchange server with all emails sent or received being blind copied to wvha@drtcpa.com.

Our website provider is Bluehost, and Wesley Slade is our main contact there. He sets up the email accounts, updates our website, and provides IT support. He provided me with the attached outline with the history of WVHA email since he's been working on it. When the Board discussed options in the summer of 2020, they chose to only utilize the Bluehost webmail as DRT was capturing emails on their exchange server. The option from Google at that time was a little under \$2k.

The WVHA needs its own email server. The current operation begun on 7/1/22 with Bluehost was a temporary measure to capture and preserve emails until we found a permanent solution. Wesley researched options for us and recommended mxroute.com. The initial cost for the new email server is \$680. This includes the set-up fee of \$615 and the yearly storage fee of \$65 for 50GB. The server will capture all emails sent and received from WVHA accounts, regardless of how they are sent.

The most important thing is that every email sent or received is captured, and we are in compliance with the public records law. I recommend that the Board approve the new email server at mxroute.com.

#### Background

- 1. The existing email system has been in use since December 2020. Prior to that, each member's personal or business emails were used.
- 2. The change from individual emails was necessary to meet the state's requirements for document retention.
- The Commissioners and professional management reviewed a proposal for business email services from Google. The discussion was tabled, and lower cost options were requested.
  - a. Cost using Google was \$6.00 per user per month x 17 x 12 = \$1,224
  - b. Maintenance and email setup \$615 one-time fee.
- Using the email provided for free with the WVHA website's hosting plan was accepted as the new email solution.
  - a. Cost was \$615 one-time setup
- 5. The consensus at the time was that only a few emails would be sent, and the additional business features from Google were not required.
- 6. Currently every email sent to a WVHA mailbox is automatically copied to the archive email box.
- 7. Currently every email sent from a WVHA webmail account is automatically sent to the archive email box.
  - a. Since 7/1/2022 this archive has been stored at the WVHA website host.
  - b. From 12/2020 to 6/30/2022 the email copies were stored at wvha@drtcpa.com

Current Status as of 8/3/22

- The 12/2020-6/30/2022 archive contains 4,116 emails and is stored on Stacy Tebo's laptop.
- The individual WVHA emails stored at the website host contain a total of
   2,711 emails and use 11.40 GB of storage space.
  - a. The archive for emails sent and received since 7/1/2022 contains
     1022 emails and uses .23 GB in storage space.
- 10. The WVHA website is using 4.45 GB in storage
- 11.WVHA website, the WVHA emails and archive is using 18% of the space allocated to 60-80 other websites.

**Requested changes** 

- 12. Move all the WVHA Emails including the archive to a new email server at mxroute.com
  - a. Cost for 50GB of storage \$65 per year using mxroute.com large account
  - b. Cost to set up new mail accounts and move the existing mail accounts \$615 one time
    - i. At the current usage rate, a 50 GB account would be full in 1.5 years.

Please forward my litigation update below, with attachments, to all Board members, today. Thank you, John

Dear Board members:

I write to provide an update on the litigation opposite the County concerning the Medicaid contribution dispute. As I reported in my July 14 update, after we filed our Notice of Appeal of Circuit Judge Weston's ruling to the Florida Fifth District Court of Appeal, the County Attorney filed a Motion to Require Supersedeas Bond (attached), which asks the trial court to require WVHA to post a bond in the amount of \$2,496,810.26 – the amount of the Medicaid contribution in dispute. Posting the bond would require WVHA to incur a fee of approximately 1.5% of the amount of the bond. As a potential resolution, I asked the County Attorney's office whether they would withdraw their Motion if WVHA deposited the funds in a separate, designated bank account maintained by WVHA. The County Attorney's initial response was that they would only agree to a resolution if WVHA deposited the funds in a third-party escrow account not maintained by WVHA. After further deliberation, the County Attorney agreed to accept my proposal under the terms of a proposed Agreed Order (attached) that would be submitted to the Court. I have conferred with Ted Small and we agree that this proposed Agreed Order is acceptable if the County Attorney will agree to replace the word "immediately" with "within 35 days of the Court's entry of this stipulation," in order to allow time to accomplish the administrative details of opening the new account. Resolution of the bond issue is desirable to allow us to focus on the substance of the legal issues on appeal and avoid collateral litigation, including the possibility of a second collateral appeal, on the bond dispute. Resolution would also avoid the prospect of incurring the expense of paying a bond fee. We request the Board's approval for us to finalize negotiating the details of proposed Agreed Order to resolve the bond issue.

#### AGREED ORDER RESOLVING COUNTY OF VOLUSIA'S MOTION TO REQUIRE SUPERSEDEAS BOND

THIS CAUSE is before the Court on the request of the parties for this Court to enter an Agreed Order Resolving County of Volusia's Motion to Require Supersedeas Bond. Having reviewed the stipulation of the parties, and otherwise being fully advised in the premises, the Court approves the stipulation of the parties and notes as follows:

1. This Court issued a Final Writ of Mandamus on June 9, 2022, commanding West Volusia Hospital Authority (WVHA) to pay its share of the County of Volusia's financial responsibility of the State of Florida's Medicaid match allocation for the fiscal year 2021-2022 in the amount of \$2,496,810.26. (Doc. 24).

2. WVHA filed a Notice of Appeal of Final Order on July 7, 2022. (Doc. 25).

3. Because WVHA is a public body, its timely filing of a notice of appeal automatically operates as a stay pending review under Fla. R. App. P 9.310(b)(2).

4. On July 11, 2022, County of Volusia filed a Motion to Require Supersedeas Bond and requested this Court to enter an order requiring WVHA to post a supersedeas bond as a lawful condition of its automatic stay pending review. (Doc. 29).

- 5. WVHA objects to the Motion.
- 6. In order to resolve the Motion to Require Supersedeas Bond, the parties stipulate

to the following:

Upon Court approval of this stipulation, WVHA will immediately deposit \$2,496,810.26 in a designated account with WVHA's bank, separate from WVHA's general operating account and all other funds, and retain this sum until the entry of mandate by the appellate court or until otherwise agreed by the parties.

7. This Court finds the above stipulation of the parties to be reasonable and in accordance with Florida law.

8. The above stipulation is approved without objection.

#### WHEREFORE, it is ORDERED and ADJUDGED:

- 1. The stipulation of the parties is approved.
- 2. WVHA will immediately deposit \$2,496,810.26 in a designated account with

WVHA's bank, separate from WVHA's general operating account and all other funds, and retain this sum until the entry of mandate by the appellate court or until otherwise agreed by the parties.

3. The Motion to Require Supersedeas Bond is dismissed without prejudice.

#### **COUNTY OF VOLUSIA'S MOTION TO REQUIRE SUPERSEDEAS BOND**

COUNTY OF VOLUSIA (the County), pursuant to Fla. R. App. P. 9.310(b)(2), moves this Court to require West Volusia Hospital Authority (WVHA) to post a supersedeas bond as a lawful condition of its automatic stay pending review. As grounds therefore, the County states:

 This Court issued its Final Writ of Mandamus on June 9, 2022 (Doc.
 commanding WVHA to pay its share of the County's financial responsibility for the State of Florida's Medicaid match allocation for the fiscal year 2021-2022 in the amount of \$2,496,810.26.

WVHA filed a Notice of Appeal of Final Order on July 7, 2022. (Doc.
 25.)

3. Because WVHA is a public body, its timely filing of a notice of appeal automatically operates as a stay pending review under Rule 9.310(b)(2).

4. However, Rule 9.310(b)(2) authorizes the trial court, upon motion, to vacate the stay or impose any lawful conditions on the stay. A bond is a lawful condition of a stay as defined under Rule 9.310(c). As explained in the Committee Notes:

Subdivision (b)(2) . . . provides for an automatic stay without bond as soon as a notice invoking jurisdiction is filed by the state or any other public body, other than in criminal cases, which are covered by rule 9.140(c)(3), but the lower tribunal may vacate the stay or require a bond.

Fla. R. App. 9.310 (emphasis added).

5. Here, the County does not seek to have the stay vacated, but merely

seeks to require a bond as a lawful condition of the stay.

6. The Florida Supreme Court agreed that courts "may require a bond of

a public body under many circumstances," but not in suits involving planning-level

legislative functions:

We, thus, construe rule 9.310(b)(2) as allowing trial and appellate courts the discretion to require governmental entities to post supersedeas bonds in suits where the judgment concerns operational-level functions but find that no authority exists to lawfully require such bonds in planning-level governmental functions.

City of Lauderdale Lakes v. Corn, 415 So. 2d 1270, 1272 (Fla. 1982).

7. In granting the County's motion for final order in mandamus, this Court necessarily concluded that WVHA's duty to pay its \$2,496,810.26 Medicaid obligation was ministerial and nondiscretionary. Therefore, paying the Medicaid

obligation was not a planning-level function. *See City of Delray Beach v. Department of Transportation*, 444 So. 2d 506 (Fla. 1st DCA 1984) (holding that requiring the city to post a supersedeas bond during stay of an order was not an abuse of discretion where judgment concerned no "decision" of city which could be characterized as either an operational or planning level-function).

8. The guiding principle in setting a supersedeas bond is to protect the party in whose favor judgment was entered by assuring its payment in the event the judgment is affirmed on appeal. *Wells v. Circle Redmont, Inc.*, 88 So. 3d 433, 435 (Fla. 5th DCA 2012).

9. In opposing the County's complaint for mandamus, WVHA emphasized that, unlike the other two hospital districts, its Medicaid obligation was no small percentage of the overall WVHA budget. WVHA argued that it was a "heavy burden to generate enough tax revenue to pay the County's Medicaid Match assessment." (Doc. 9, p. 19.)

10. As alleged in the County's complaint for mandamus and acknowledged in WVHA's response, WVHA levied \$2,359,000 from its taxpayers to pay its 2021-2022 Medicaid obligation. But WVHA held on to the money—refusing to pay the County pursuant to section 409.915(5), Fla. Stat. (2021). Even without WVHA's participation, the County still had to make monthly payments to the state pursuant to section 409.915(4) to satisfy the entire Medicaid obligation. A bond will ensure that the funds levied from West Volusia residents remain available to satisfy WVHA's 2021-2022 Medicaid obligation once appellate review is completed. The citizens of West Volusia should not risk being taxed twice, and the citizens who don't live in West Volusia should not risk paying the Medicaid obligation of the entire county. A bond will protect all parties from the risk of mismanagement, dissolution, or other unforeseen circumstances.

WHEREFORE, the County respectfully moves this Court to impose a condition on the automatic stay pending appellate review requiring WVHA to post a good and sufficient bond for \$2,496,810.26.
